What is the NOPAIN Act?

The Non-Opioids Prevent Addiction in the Nation (NOPAIN) Act – is a U.S. federal law designed to combat the opioid crisis by expanding Medicare reimbursement for non-opioid pain relief options used during Hospital Outpatient Department (HOPD) and Ambulatory Surgery Center (ASC) procedures.

Beginning January 1, 2026, Medicare will provide separate reimbursement for qualifying PAJUNK regional anesthesia devices* that reduce the need for opioids, empowering clinicians to choose safer, multimodal pain strategies.

The NOPAIN Act allows for separate Medicare reimbursement of PAJUNK approved non-opioid devices in Outpatient Settings beginning January 1, 2026. HCPCS code C9814 applies to SonoLong starting January 1, 2026, and to both SonoLong and E-Cath starting February 1, 2026.
